Cherry Pecan Coffee Cake

CHERRY PECAN COFFEE CAKE

Coat the greased kugelhof mold with fine bread crumbs so the bread will be easy to remove after baking—

4 cups all-purpose flour

1 package active dry yeast

½ teaspoon salt

½ teaspoon ground cardamom

. . .

1½ cups milk

½ cup sugar

½ cup butter or margarine

. . .

2 beaten eggs

1 cup coarsely chopped candied cherries

½ cup chopped pecans

1 tablespoon butter or margarine

3 tablespoons fine dry bread crumbs

In large mixer bowl, combine 2¼ cups of the flour, the yeast, salt, and cardamom. In saucepan, heat milk, sugar, and the ½ cup butter or margarine just till warm (115° to 120°), stirring to melt butter. Add to flour mixture in mixer bowl; add eggs. Beat at low speed of electric mixer ½ minute, scraping sides of bowl constantly. Beat 3 minutes at high speed. By hand, stir in remaining flour, cherries, and pecans. Cover; let rise in warm place till double, about 1 hour.

Meanwhile, generously grease a 3-quart kugelhof mold with the 1 tablespoon butter. Coat mold with bread crumbs. Stir down batter. Let rest 10 minutes. Turn into mold. Cover; let rise till double, about 45 minutes. Bake in 375° oven 45 to 50 minutes or till done. Cover with foil after first 25 minutes of baking. Remove from pan; cool on rack. Makes 1 coffee cake.
