

LOVE 'N' KISSES CHOCOLATE CAKE

- $\frac{1}{2}$ cup unsweetened cocoa powder
- $\frac{1}{2}$ cup boiling water
- 4 egg whites
- $\frac{1}{4}$ tsp. cream of tartar
- $\frac{1}{4}$ cup sugar
- $\frac{3}{4}$ cup unsifted cake flour
- 1 cup sugar
- $\frac{3}{4}$ tsp. baking soda
- $\frac{1}{2}$ tsp. salt
- $\frac{1}{4}$ cup vegetable oil
- 4 egg yolks
- 1 tsp. vanilla
- $1\frac{1}{2}$ cups heavy cream
- $\frac{1}{4}$ cup confectioners' sugar
- Milk chocolate kisses for garnish
- Candied cherries for garnish

Wax-paper line, grease, and flour bottoms of two 9-inch heart-shaped or round cake pans.

Combine cocoa and boiling water; cool. Beat egg whites and cream of tartar in small mixer bowl until frothy; gradually add $\frac{1}{4}$ cup sugar and beat until stiff peaks form. Set aside.

Combine flour, 1 cup sugar, baking soda, and salt in large mixer bowl. Add oil, egg yolks, vanilla, and cooled chocolate mixture; beat until smooth on low speed of mixer. Fold about $\frac{1}{4}$ of beaten egg whites into chocolate mixture, blending completely. Gently fold in remaining egg whites. Pour batter into prepared pans. Bake at 350° for 18 to 20 minutes or until top springs back when touched lightly. Cool 10 minutes. Remove from pans; cool completely.

Whip cream with confectioners' sugar; fill and frost cake with 2 cups whipped cream. Fill decorator tube with remaining whipped cream; create lattice design with rosette tip. Garnish with milk chocolate kisses and
